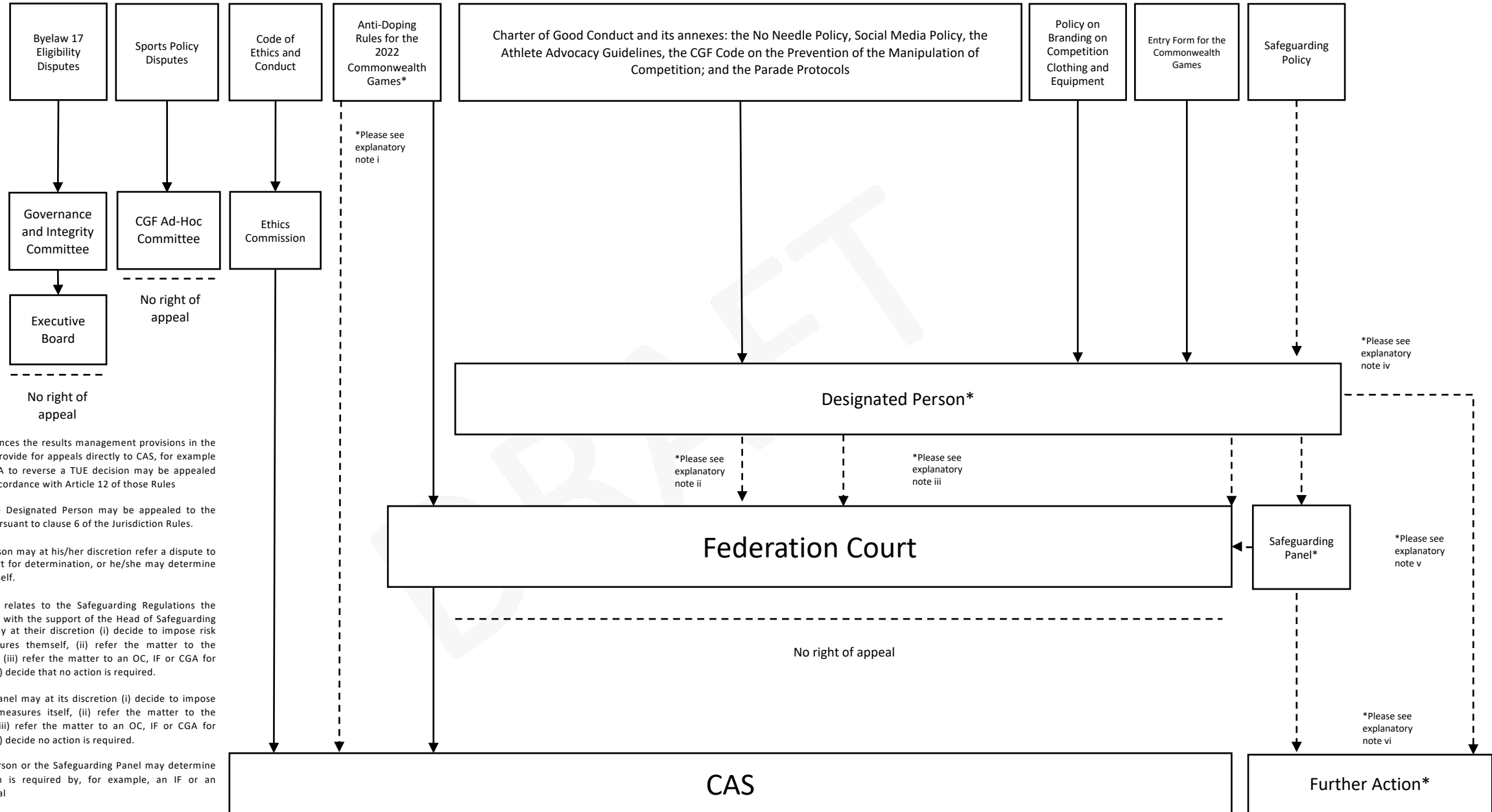


# CGF Jurisdiction Rules Flowchart



## Explanatory notes

- i. In certain circumstances the results management provisions in the Anti-Doping Rules provide for appeals directly to CAS, for example a decision by WADA to reverse a TUE decision may be appealed directly to CAS in accordance with Article 12 of those Rules
- ii. The decision of the Designated Person may be appealed to the Federation Court pursuant to clause 6 of the Jurisdiction Rules.
- iii. The Designated Person may at his/her discretion refer a dispute to the Federation Court for determination, or he/she may determine the matter him/herself.
- iv. Where the dispute relates to the Safeguarding Regulations the Designated Person, with the support of the Head of Safeguarding and any others, may at their discretion (i) decide to impose risk management measures themselves, (ii) refer the matter to the Safeguarding Panel, (iii) refer the matter to an OC, IF or CGA for further action, or (iv) decide that no action is required.
- v. The Safeguarding Panel may at its discretion (i) decide to impose risk management measures itself, (ii) refer the matter to the Federation Court, (iii) refer the matter to an OC, IF or CGA for further action, or (iv) decide no action is required.
- vi. The Designated Person or the Safeguarding Panel may determine that Further Action is required by, for example, an IF or an Employment Tribunal
