

TUE APPLICATION PROCESS



TUE applications should be submitted a month before the Games commence where possible, to ensure applications are processed in a timely manner.

Complete the CGF TUE application form available on the [CGF website](#) including all the required signatures.

Submit the completed application form along with the required medical documentation (at the very least a doctor's report) to tue@thecgf.com.

Your application will be submitted to the CGF TUE Committee for processing. The decision will be made as soon as possible and usually within 21 days of receipt of the complete application.

The CGF TUE Committee has **approved** your TUE application.

You will be notified in writing of the CGF TUE Committee's decision, and it will also be reported in ADAMS.

You are advised to carry a copy of your TUE to the Games. Should you be drug tested, please make note of your TUE certificate reference on the Doping Control Form.

The CGF TUE Committee has **denied** your TUE application.

You will be notified in writing of the CGF TUE Committee's decision along with reason(s) for the denial and the decision will also be reported in ADAMS.

You may refer the matter to the Australian Sports Drug Medical Advisory Committee (ASDMAC) for appeal.

If further documentation is requested, you should re-apply to tue@thecgf.com as soon as possible.

TUE RECOGNITION PROCESS



I have a valid TUE that was issued by my National Anti-Doping Organisation (NADO) or my International Federation (IF)

TUE available on ADAMS

The TUE to be submitted to the CGF via ADAMS for recognition at least 30 days prior to the Games period (i.e., not later than 27 June 2022)

TUE not available on ADAMS

You must submit the TUE to the CGF TUE Committee on tue@thecgf.com at least 30 days prior to the Games period (i.e., no later than 27 June 2022)

The CGF is entitled to review any TUE granted by your NADO or IF to ensure it meets the ISTUE criteria. Request for further documentation may be made to complete the review.

The TUE does **NOT** meet the ISTUE criteria and will not be valid for the 2022 Commonwealth Games.

You will be notified in writing of the CGF TUE Committee's decision explaining the reasons for the decision. The decision will be reported in ADAMS for TUEs that are already in ADAMS.

You may appeal the CGF TUE Committee's decision not to recognise your TUE to the Australian Sports Drug Medical Advisory Committee (ASDMAC).

The TUE **MEETS** the ISTUE criteria and will be recognised and valid for the Commonwealth Games

You will be notified in writing of the CGF TUE Committee's decision to recognise the TUE. The decision to recognise will be updated in ADAMS for TUEs that are already in ADAMS.

RETROACTIVE TUE PROCESS



Retroactive TUE applications should be submitted as soon as possible.

Complete the CGF TUE application form available on the [CGF website](#) and ensure section 3 of the form is also filled out.

Submit the completed application form along with the required medical documentation (at the very least a doctor's report) to tue@thecgf.com.

Your application will be submitted to the CGF TUE Committee on an urgent basis for processing. Provided the application is complete, a decision will be made as soon as possible. You will be notified in writing and the decision will be uploaded in ADAMS.

A retroactive TUE may only be applied for if one of the following circumstances apply (refer Article 4.5 of the [CGF 2022 Anti-Doping Rules](#) for details) –

- *The athlete is not an international or national level athlete and has been tested*
- *Emergency treatment of a medical condition*
- *Insufficient time or opportunity to apply for a TUE*
- *Athlete used out-of-competition, a substance prohibited in-competition for therapeutic reasons*
- *It would be deemed unfair not to grant a TUE subject to WADA's approval*
