

The Birmingham Organising Committee for the 2022 Commonwealth Games Limited (“**Birmingham 2022**”, “**we**”, “**us**”, or “**our**”) is committed to respecting your privacy and safeguarding your personal data. When you give us information about you, we are responsible for looking after that information and for telling you what we do with your personal data. The purpose of this Entry and Eligibility Privacy Notice is to set out how and why we process your personal data, and what to expect from us. This Entry and Eligibility Privacy Notice, together with our main Privacy Notice (which can be found at [Birmingham 2022 Privacy Notice](#) and which sets out more information about what we do with your personal data), applies to individuals who are Participants at the XXII Commonwealth Games to be held in Birmingham in 2022 (the “**Games**”).

DEFINITIONS

“**Accreditation**” means the process of identifying and registering a Participant and their role, and producing, distributing, and validating the accreditation pass that permits the Accredited Persons access rights to enable them to perform their role at Birmingham 2022. The accreditation (i) ensures that only the appropriately qualified and eligible Participants are entitled to participate in or perform official functions at Birmingham 2022; (ii) limits Participants’ access to areas that they need to go to perform their official functions and keeps unauthorised people out of secured zones; and (iii) ensures that Participants identify that they are eligible to be present at the Games and Games Venues and that they are able to reach those areas in a safe and orderly manner.

“**Accredited Persons**” means (i) all Participants applying for, or being granted, the right to be accredited for the Games and (ii) all Participants applying for, or being granted an accreditation pass for a Games Venue/s.

“**Games Family**” means a broad range of guests, primarily invited by the CGF, the CGAs and the Organising Committee. The Games Family includes Internationally Protected Persons (IPPs, e.g., a Head of State), international and domestic dignitaries, Presidents and Secretary Generals of CGAs, International Federations and National Sporting Bodies as well as WADA, CAS, senior executives of Sponsors, Broadcasters, the current and future Organising Committees as well as Candidate Cities representatives. They are equivalent to the VIPs of the Commonwealth Games e.g., Her Majesty the Queen.

“**Games Venues**” means any location (including public areas, where applicable) at or in which the Games are taking place, at which a Games event will be staged and/or where access is controlled by CGFP and/or Birmingham 2022 and/or is subject to accreditation, and includes, for the avoidance of doubt all competition venues and stadia approved by Birmingham 2022, the Games villages, any satellite athletes villages, training Venues of the Games, any media/press centre and any means of access into and out of any such venue;

“**Participants**” means the athletes, coaches, trainers, Chef de Missions, other team officials and Games Family attending the Games.

“Personal Data” means any information related to any identified or indefinable Accredited Persons.

“Purpose” means the purposes set out below in ‘*how is processing your information lawful*’

“Responsible Organisation” means any organisation seeking Accreditation for its Accredited Persons, responsible for collecting and submitting to Birmingham 2022 certain Personal Data and other accreditation information on behalf of each Accredited Person who requires Accreditation.

WHAT INFORMATION DO WE COLLECT?

We will process the following personal data and sensitive personal data in order to facilitate your participation in, and our management of, the Games:

- **“Identity Data”** includes first name, middle name, last name, previous name(s), preferred name, title, date of birth, age, gender, country/city of birth, nationality, Identification Document (document type, number, date of issue and expiry, issuing country and photograph);
- **“Image Data”** photographs, video footage, voice, likeness and personal social handles;
- **“Health and Accessibility Data”**: includes accessibility information (including if a wheelchair, chaperone, carer, guide, or assistance dog is required), and medical information and requirements (including doctor referrals and prescriptions, medical examination reports, laboratory tests, radiographs) and physiological information (including height, weight, biometrics, illness, injuries, and dietary requirements);
- **“Contact Data”**: includes postal/residential address, email address, and telephone numbers, public social media accounts;
- **“Sport Data”**: includes sport and discipline(s), team, performances, results, International Federation registration number, professional membership and registration details, responsible organisation, Commonwealth Games Association (CGA),
- **“Travel and Accommodation Data”**: includes arrival and departure information, accommodation information and booking reference numbers;
- Other relevant information necessary for or in relation to the protection of life, body or property of a person, the security, the preparation, promotion, presentation and operation of the Games, the prevention of the manipulation of competitions.

HOW IS PROCESSING YOUR INFORMATION LAWFUL?

We are allowed to process your personal data for the following reasons and on the following legal bases:

Accessibility Data**

- To protect the health and wellbeing of Accredited Persons (*Key activities include: the provision of healthcare, insurance and medical services to Accredited Persons at the occasion of the Games, the monitoring and treatment of athlete injuries, illnesses, diseases or any other health states at the Games*);
- To protect the integrity of the sport competitions of the Games and ensuring the compliance of activities occurring at the Games with the Constitution of the CGF and the rules of your relevant sport and other rules applicable to Participants and, where applicable, other Accredited Persons (*Key activities include: prevention of manipulation of competitions and more generally the identification, investigation and prosecution of suspected or actual breaches of the CGF Code of Ethics and other rules applicable to Participants (as detailed in section 3 of the Entry and Eligibility Conditions Form)*);
- To ensure we treat everyone equally and fairly and support your needs.

processing is necessary:

- for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the controller
- to exercise a protective function for reasons of substantial public interest as follows: standards of behaviour in sport (for the purposes of measures designed to protect the integrity of a sport or sporting event) or the equality of opportunity and treatment.

Where we have relied on 'legitimate interests' i.e. we have good, sensible, practical reasons for processing your personal data which is in the interests of Birmingham 2022, we have considered the impact on your interests and rights, and have placed appropriate safeguards to ensure that the intrusion on your privacy is reduced as much as possible.

HOW LONG DO WE KEEP YOUR PERSONAL DATA?

We will keep the personal data of the applicants for as long as we reasonably require to conclude your participation in, and our management of, the Games. We will then ensure your personal data is deleted. Personal Data of Accredited Persons may be kept for a longer period of time where necessary to fulfil the Purposes including:

- without limitation, information deemed of historical interest (such as Sport Data and Image Data);
- information related to the compliance with the Constitution of the CGF, CGF Code of Ethics and other rules applicable to Accredited Persons (such as Sport Data, Health and Accessibility Data

which may be kept as long as necessary to fulfil the relevant purpose.

WHO WILL HAVE ACCESS TO YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?

In order to permit your entry to and participation in the Games we will need to share your personal data with some third-party organisations either because they are a key service provider or for legal, regulatory and health and safety reasons.

Accreditation (Identity Data):

In order to carry out the required security and accreditation checks of those individuals who have submitted the Entry and Eligibility Conditions Form to participate in the Games we will need to disclose your personal data to relevant central government, governmental agencies and departments, including the Home Office (ministerial department of the Government of the United Kingdom, responsible for immigration, security, and law and order), UKBF (Border Force), relevant police departments, Responsible Organisations and the relevant International Federations.

Covid Testing (Health and Accessibility Data):

We will appoint a third-party organisation to provide Covid-19 testing. For this purpose, we will share the above personal data.

Healthcare and Medical Service Providers (Health and Accessibility Data):

We will appoint third party organisations to provide health and medical services. For this purpose, we will share the above personal data.

Commonwealth Games Federation (CGF) and Commonwealth Games Federation Partnership (CGFP) (Identity Data, Contact Data, Sport Data, Image Data)

CGF and CGFP host the games time management system that holds the Participants' Identity and Contact Data collected by the OC for the purposes set out in 'how is processing your information lawful'. For this purpose, we will share the above personal data.

CGF, as the organisation responsible for the direction, control, vision and ambition of the Commonwealth Games requires the Sport Data to keep official records of and other relevant information about the Games and the participants to support future Commonwealth Games planning needs and optimisation processes. For this purpose, we will share the above personal data and CGF will become an independent controller of this personal data.

CGF also requires the Image Data for the broadcasting, filming, photographing and promotion of our events. For this purpose, we will share the above personal data and CGF will become an independent controller of this personal data.

Travel and Accommodation Providers (Travel and Accommodation Data and Identity Data (name only)):

We will appoint third party organisations to provide travel and accommodation services. For this purpose, we will share the above personal data.

International Sports Federations

For the purpose of confirming eligibility we may share the following personal data with the relevant International Sports Federation: Accreditation ID (produced by our system), Preferred Given Name, Preferred Family Name, CGA Code, Gender and Date of Birth.

Rights-holding Broadcasters and other relevant media (Image Data)

The British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC) have been appointed as the UK rights-holding broadcaster who will cover and report on the Games, for this purpose we will share the above personal data.

We will appoint an Australian rights-holding broadcaster who will cover and report on the Games, for this purpose we will share the above personal data.
